". . . or if we are of sound mind, it is for you. For the love of Christ compels us. . . Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God."

2 Corinthians 5:13c-14a, 20 (NKJV)

"If you are confident in your beliefs then you don't feel the need to 'save' everyone else." * According to a news article, this statement was in a posted response to a picture shared on Facebook of teens praying in a restaurant before eating their meal. There were a multitude of comments, good and bad, offensive and ridiculous, to this post of young people displaying their faith. However, I want to address the concept within the quote above: that those who truly have assurance in their faith will not feel an obligation to share the Gospel with others. For the Christian, nothing should be further from the truth.

Within the Scripture passage bounded by the verses above, God's truth, seen throughout Scripture, is reiterated. Jesus died once for all that we might be restored to a right relationship (reconciled) with God! Through Christ, God is calling all to be reconciled to Him. God committed this truth to us who believe that we might share it with those who do not. This is the ministry that God has given to every Christian and it is our obligation to share this message, "*For all who call upon the Lord shall be saved*" (Romans 10:13).

Sharing the Good News of the Gospel should also be a desire: a need. Why? Because the very love of Christ, the agape love that took Him to the cross, is a characteristic inherent in the new nature of the Believer. This love is not narcissistic, it puts the needs of others first (Philippians 2). It manifests as concern for the plights of others and a desire to help where possible. And the greatest danger facing any person is to stand before God in judgment without knowing Jesus as Lord!. Take a minute to call to mind all the people you know. Is there anyone in that group for whom Jesus did not die? Think of all the people in the world that you do not know. Do you believe that there is a person within that group that Jesus will not receive if they turn to Him in sincere repentance and faith? Given what the Spirit says in John 3:16-17, is there anyone that Jesus does not love and desire to save? The answer to all these questions is a resounding, "No.", for God bound all men over to sin for one reason: that He might have mercy on them all (Romans 11:32)!

When we received Jesus, we received a ministry. A ministry that is an extension of the love of God for all people. I pray that you will share the truth that has been committed to you boldly with others. And if they ask you why you are doing it, tell them it is the love of Jesus, displayed to all at Calvary, that compels you.

Cindy and I spent last weekend in Star City, Arkansas where we had the privilege of seeking the Lord with Pastor Cory Matlock of Kirkwood Baptist Church for ways to reach out in his community. By the Lord's grace, we believe that some new avenues for evangelism were given by God that were tailored to the unique setting of Kirkwood Baptist and its different, available venues for reaching out. Please keep your Brothers and Sisters at Kirkwood Baptist in your prayers as they move forward to glorify God by lifting Jesus in their community. 
