No Thanks I'm Good

"What's this? I don't get it." Thus began my conversation with Orlando and Madison.

Our team had just arrived at the boardwalk in Ocean City, MD for another evening of sharing the Gospel. I began to distribute the tract shown to the right. The very first two that I passed out were to a couple walking down the boardwalk: Orlando and Madison, whose names I learned later in our conversation. They looked at the front then Orlando made the comments above. I replied, "Don't all of us like to think we're good? The question is, "Are we really good or are we fooling ourselves?" Read the first paragraph inside." Both of them opened up the tract and began to read.

All of us like to think we are good. The truth? None of us are. We have all defied God and broken His Law (sinned). We have lied, stolen, cheated, lusted, and worshipped things besides God. In spite of any good things you may think you have done, by God's standard, which is the only one that matters, you

are guilty because of your sin.

When they looked up again, I said, "We tend to compare ourselves to others when we consider

whether or not we are good. However, the only standard for goodness that matters is God's. And by that measure, none of us are good. All of us have thought, said, or done things that God says we shouldn't think, say, or do. That's a simple definition for sin and all of us have done these things." As we continued to talk, I spoke to them regarding the Lord's judgment on sin and the penalty for it: an eternity in hell. Then I told them about God's provision for our sin: Jesus on the cross. Our conversation continued with the contrast of the wage we deserve for our sin v. the gift of mercy and grace known as eternal life that Jesus has made available to those who will receive Him as Lord. Finally, we spoke about repentance and the commitment embodied within it as an individual turns from their sin to the Lord.

We conversed for quite a while. Orlando and Madison had questions, which I did my best to answer then I would turn the conversation back to the Gospel. As we talked, I had watched their countenance change as they were convicted by the Spirit. When I called them to a decision regarding what they had heard, both Orlando and Madison chose to repent and call upon the Lord for salvation!

Eleven men were on the team that shared Christ at Ocean City. The Lord used all of us, for which we are grateful to Him! The Gospel was shared with thousands through Gospel tracts, sketch-boarding, open-air preaching, and one-on-one or small group conversations.

Thank you to Mark Johnson for his work in setting up this mission and for the invitation to serve in it. Also, a big thank you to the couple who graciously provided lodging for the team. They could have easily rented their beach house for the week; instead, they offered it to the Lord's service! What a blessing to Him and us!

It's been a busy month since our last newsletter. Before I served at Beach Reach (above), I led a team of men (David Cobb, Jeff Fauver, Richard Jones, Richard Palmer, and myself) to Indianapolis to share Jesus with the crowd that came to town for the festivities over Memorial Day weekend. Saturday morning, after our devotional time, we headed for downtown Indy and the Festival 500 parade. The parade is a great place for distributing Gospel tracts. This year the parade crowd was estimated at 300,000 people. Friday and Saturday evening were spent on Georgetown Rd. by the race track. We spent the evenings sharing the Gospel through tracts and conversations. Thousands of tracts were handed out over our two days in Indy and there were many conversations in which the Gospel was shared and explained.

I want to thank Shane, who has provided us with parking down by the track since I have led this mission. Parking is a premium there, yet he gives us a place to park so the Gospel can be shared. As well, I want to thank Tom who provided a mission house for our use while we were in the city. I am grateful to the Lord for both of these men!

Closer to home this month, Cindy and I have served as chaplains at Hillman Ferry (KY) and at multiple local foodbanks. At these, we share the Gospel and minister to other needs as they are revealed, praying with/for people as they express their concerns. Some of the stories are heart-breaking and we are thankful to be used by the Lord to both proclaim His truth and speak His peace into the lives of others as we minister.

Beginning in August, we will have a new facet of ministry. The reversal of Roe v Wade (Praise the Lord!) has caused a Memphis abortion mill to move to Carbondale, IL, which is 20 miles away. They are scheduled to begin this evil in August of this year. We will be spending time there in prayer and presence seeking to reach out to both the "patients" and the workers with the truth of God's word and the compassion of His love through us. We ask for your prayers as we seek direction in this new endeavor.

We are also seeking those who live in the area who feel led to join us in standing for life in His grace.
