"They remembered that God was their rock, the Most High God their redeemer." Psalm 78:35 (ESV)

The solemn truth of the Gospel is that, in spiritual things, you get what you set your heart on. Set your heart on knowing God and He will reveal Himself through His Word; set your heart on serving Him and you will not lack the opportunity to do so. But set your heart on nothing of spiritual consequence, and that is precisely what you will receive --- nothing of spiritual consequence. Set your heart on your own ambitions, and they will, very likely, be fulfilled. God may give you your heart's desire. He did exactly that for His people in the wilderness. He saved them for His own sake and glory, and led them through the desert, yet, "they soon forgot his works; they did not wait for his council. But they had a wanton craving in the wilderness, and put God to the test in the desert; he gave them what they asked, but sent a wasting disease among them" (Psalm 106:13-15, ESV, emphasis added).

All that, despite Moses' warning to them: "And if you forget the Lord your God and go after other gods and serve them and worship them, I solemnly warn you today that you will surely perish. Like the nations the Lord makes to perish before you, so shall you perish, because you would not obey the voice of the Lord your God" (Deuteronomy 8:19-20, ESV).

Think for a moment about where your life has led you thus far? What ambitions and aspirations have been fulfilled? Has the Lord given you many of the things you longed for --- materially, personally, socially, professionally? But now, meditate on this: *Do you have the Lord Himself with these things, or do you have them without Him?* Have you forgotten the Lord?

The man or woman who has a heart for God will be someone who is determined to remember the Lord.
