Come unto Me. . . I will give you rest

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“. . . And yet I show you a more excellent way.”

1 Corinthians 12:31 (NKJV)

Spiritual gifts. God uses them through you for the building of the Body: His church. They are so useful and important to the Body of Christ that the Holy Spirit grants every Believer at least one. The Reason? That every Christian would have a role for use by the Lord in building this current Kingdom we call the Church. Paul speaks to the gifts and their importance. Yet, as he continues in the Spirit, he illuminates a vital truth. *Love surpasses every gift.*

Why would this be true? Because love (agape) is about an attitude that is both a motive and catalyst for action. Consider the following verses (all are NKJV).

Revelation 1:5–6

...To Him who loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood. . .to Him *be* glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.

Galatians 5:13

¹³ For you, brethren, have been called to liberty; only do not *use* liberty as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another.

Ephesians 5:1–2 (NKJV)

Therefore be imitators of God as dear children. ² And walk in love, as Christ also has loved us and given Himself for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God. . .

Colossians 3:12–14 (NKJV)

¹² Therefore, as *the* elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering; ¹³ bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also *must do*. ¹⁴ But above all these things put on love, which is the bond of perfection.

1 John 4:8–11 (NKJV)

⁹ In this the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through Him. ¹⁰ In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son *to be* the propitiation for our sins. ¹¹ Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

1 Corinthians 16:14 (NKJV)

¹⁴ Let all *that* you do be done with love.

It is the love of God that made mercy available to us through His manifold wisdom. It was the action of Christ, God Incarnate, who humbled Himself “even to death on a cross” that displayed the depths of God’s love for us. And it is the Holy Spirit who brings the truth of this type of love into our lives so that, as we come to understand God’s love, the transformation of our minds regarding true love would become the motive and catalyst for all we do. Without the expression of such love, we will never live the life Christ died to give us. We will never know the fullness, the completeness, we are meant to realize when we attempt to live the Christ-life without the expression of love toward God and others. For if love is not the driving force of our worship/service/ministry, our lives are but a poor semblance of the reality that can be (1 Corinthians 13:1-3).

What is the life that can be? Paul begins to describe that life as he continues in 13:4. It is a life lived with the agenda of “others” rather than “self”. Such a life mirrors the example of our Lord; our lives become a profession of love for God as others become the recipients of His love through us (John 14:15, 15:12) and the Law is fulfilled (Romans 13:10, Galatians 5:14, James 2:6).

Love. It is to shape our thoughts, fuel our compassion, and drive our actions. Love weaves together our new nature as Christians in a way that highlights all that we are for His Glory. Lavishly bestowed upon us by God, love is to be freely given to others. For it is love, the more excellent way, that truly reveals to the world you are His.

“By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another.”

John 13:35 (NKJV)

May the life you live be one that is motivated by and displays the very love that allowed you to become the Lord’s child to all that will see.
