***“Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Do not be carried about with various and strange doctrines. For it is good that the heart be established by grace. . .”***

Hebrews 13:8–9 (NKJV)

Immutability. That attribute, or characteristic, of God that allows Him to proclaim through His prophet, I am the LORD; I change not. . . (Mal 3:6). Who and what God is, in all His uniqueness and glory, He always has been and always will be: without variation. . .forever. Christians should both revel and rest in the aforementioned truth for because of it, God's word to us, also, will never change. And within His word, we find the Gospel of grace.

Grace. The Bible states, *“For by grace you are saved, through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God.”* (Eph 2:8). Strong's defines grace, in part, as, “The absolutely free expression of the loving kindness of God to men finding its only motive in the bounty and benevolence of the Giver”. In other words, grace is God inspired, God motivated, and God bestowed. It was initiated when God said, “Let there be light”, and fully revealed in the death, burial, and resurrection of the Lord Jesus through which God offers forgiveness, restoration, and hope; an offer that still stands today. For within the purity of God's word this promise is clearly revealed; “. . .whoever calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved” (Rom 10:13).

The writer of Hebrews understood this. And when men became discouraged and considered either reverting to the old ways of honoring God or adopting different doctrines of “faith”, he wrote to his contemporaries regarding the superiority of Christ. Moved by the Spirit, this man contrasted the preeminence of Jesus' personhood, His ministry, and His sacrifice to the efforts of men to follow God's Law, revealing that the things of men were but a mere shadow of both what had come (Christ's ministry) and what was available to those who trusted and followed Jesus. He encouraged his peers to embrace Christ and reject doctrines, both old and new, that others espoused as a replacement, or enhancement, to faith in Christ.

We face the same challenges today. The melding of worldly things into the worship of God in an effort to attract the world to the church, heresies that reject part of God's word as being “no longer relevant”, and blasphemies that promote the distortion of God's truth (Do you remember who did that first?) in favor of the sinful desires of mankind. The doctrines of men are being proclaimed as doctrine from God. These things neither exalt Christ nor elevate our relationship with Him. Instead, they detract from the uniqueness and superiority of Jesus and the grace available only through Him.

*We must never forget that it is through grace, the undeserved merit freely bestowed by God on those who set their hope fully in Jesus, that we receive righteousness, and a hope that will not fail, before God.*

*Is your heart truly grounded and established in the Lord's grace?*

At the beginning of May we went to Memphis to share the Gospel at the RIVERBEAT Music Festival. We were blessed to have 20 men and women on Beale Street lifting Jesus before the crowd. During the 2 days we were on the street, over 3,000 Gospel tracts, as well as New Testaments and other literature, were distributed. There were many conversations, both of a ministry and evangelistic nature, and 5 people professed faith in the Lord Jesus! Discipleship information has been sent to these new Believers. Please be in prayer for their assimilation into the Body of Christ.

A report on a mission, like the one above, is something you normally read in our newsletter. This time, I want to mention some other aspects of the ministry of Call of Grace. Why? Because the Lord has provided the ability for these things to occur through the funds you have provided. You have freely given of God's providence to you! Because of this, in the past 5 months we have been able to:

- Provide aid toward the educational needs of children in an orphanage overseas.
- Provide hundreds of Bibles for churches and for distribution where Bibles are a rare commodity.
- Provide for the housing of a pastor's widow and her children *for the year*.
- Provide the funds necessary to rebuild a storm-damaged girls hygiene facility at a Church-run orphanage.

A sentiment shared by all the recipients is that we thank those who "joined hands" to help them in their need. That's you. Thank you for allowing the Lord to use you as a part of this ministry. May He bless you with the realization of the knowledge of what He is doing, and can do, through you!

In addition to what you have read, I have been preaching when called upon and we are always involved in various local missions. A new opportunity regarding this involves working with the local SBC association to encourage others to participate in their foodbank: particularly in the chaplaincy facet of this ministry. We appreciate your prayers for this endeavor, as we do for all things.
