“Now all things are of God, who has reconciled us to Himself through Jesus Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation. . .”

2 Corinthians 5:18 (NKJV)

God, in His mercy and grace, has brought us to a place of right relationship with Him through our Lord Jesus Christ. He has bestowed upon us the great and awesome blessings that we see in the promises found in His Word; promises that we find are ours when we embrace them (2 Cor 1:20). These, too, are ours because of the Lord Jesus. The Lord has blessed us with good things beyond what we can imagine! And among them is the privilege of having tasks to perform for His glory. (Eph 2:10).

Of all the purposes God has for us, the greatest is the ministry of reconciliation: the honor of proclaiming the Good News of Jesus to others so they have the opportunity to respond to the Lord, even as we did. Why do I say this purpose is the greatest? Because Jesus came “to seek and to save the lost” (Lk 19:10). He then passed the torch of proclaiming this truth to us: His Church. It was His command (Matt 28:18-20), therefore it is to be our reality (Acts 1:8, Matt 5:13-16). And do not overlook the very great privilege that we have of being God’s “fellow workers” in fields that are still white unto harvest. And while the harvest belongs to the Lord who gives increase, we are tasked to tend the fields, encouraging growth toward the Lord’s harvest time.

How can we do that? We must *speak and live the Gospel* even as we must *call the world to respond* to this message of mercy and hope. We must speak the Gospel. For, “faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God” (Rom 10:17). We must live the Gospel; the life of freedom and peace that Jesus died to give us. For if we don’t, we are the salt that is trampled underfoot or the the light under a bushel; in other words, we are forsaking our purpose (Matt 5:13-16). And we must always call the world to respond. Not to us, not to a church (although you should be in one), but to the Lord. For it is the Lord who saves and transforms the Lost even as he is doing for/to you and me. And this occurs as we embrace the task given to all Believers.

The God-given task called “The Ministry of Reconciliation”.

Riverbeat in Memphis (Memphis in May) has come and gone. This year 10 men participated in this mission. There were 3 professions of faith, 2 rededications to the faith, and approximately 2,000 tracts were distributed as we engaged with people during our two days on the street. As well there were numerous prayers offered to the Lord as people asked us to intercede for their needs and concerns. Please pray for the follow-up on the 5 who received or came back to the Lord as well as for all the work done in the Beale Street field of the Lord. May He continue the growth of those who were touched toward a harvest in His time.
